This section describes how Alameda County will reduce greenhouse gas emissions in County fleet operations and employee commutes. As this plan is implemented...





Employees may notice:

-  More electric vehicle charging stations available.
-  More access to electric vehicles for on-the-job travel.
-  Updated parking policies.
-  Exploration of incentives for clean commuting like carpooling, vanpooling, taking transit, or biking.
-  More active transit options such as electric bikes and scooters.
-  Access to regional electric bike lending programs.
-  A new strategy for Alameda County employee shuttle program focusing on first and last-mile services.
-  Access to a department Clipper Card for on-the-job travel.
-  Promotion of a ride-sharing program for employees.
-  More collaboration among agencies to support clean commutes and electric vehicles.

Everyone may notice:

-  More public electric vehicle charging stations at County facilities.
-  More parking throughout Alameda County for carpools, low-emission vehicles, and all-electric vehicles.

What you can do:

-  Consider whether you could try a clean commute such as public transit, carpooling, or ridesharing. See 511.org. If you are a County employee, visit commute.acgov.org for options and carpool matching.
-  Encourage sustainable transit on the job. If you are a County employee, check out a fleet electric vehicle.
